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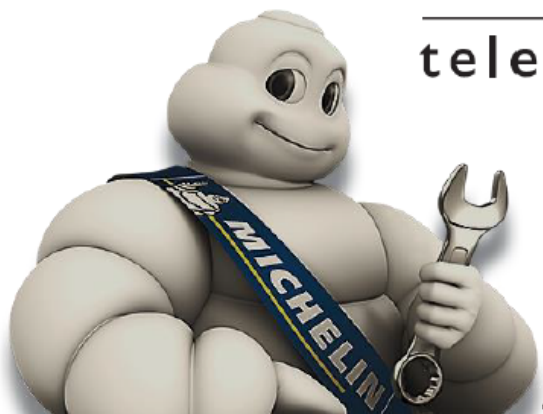

TRADE SPACE

Trade spaces are available in 3m x 3m lots and can be either powered or unpowered.

All traders **must** have a minimum \$20 million Public Liability Insurance. If you do not have your own you can be added to the Tullamore PA & H Association policy for a \$15 fee.

Trade fees include entry to the Tullamore Show for 2 people and 1 nights camping accommodation.

Trade Space Rates:

3x3m Powered \$20, 3x3m Unpowered \$15, Large Machinery Space \$1 per square metre.

If you plan to spend additional time in Tullamore please see the camping fees below.

Conditions:

The Tullamore PA & H Association Inc welcomes trade space holders to participate in our annual show by selling or advertising their products and/or services. Although there are many traders who offer different products, we are aware there may be those that offer similar products.

The Tullamore PA & H Association Inc Committee feels it is in the best interest of our show and the attending public that we offer any trade space holders the chance to attend our show providing they are not selling products, advertising or offering services that are listed on our banned items list, Showmen's Guild line list or that the Tullamore PA & H Association Inc deems not suitable.

Please note: Some food products will not be available for sale by Trade Space Holders as this is a main source of fundraising for the PA & H. Please contact our show secretary if you have food products for sale before returning your application form.

CAMPING

The Tullamore showground offers camping/caravan sites all year round.

We have many powered and non-powered sites along with toilets/showers and dump site.

During show time camping fees can be paid prior to your stay via direct bank deposit.

Please ensure you email or phone our secretary so we can allocate payment to you. Alternatively, payment can be made on the Saturday of the show to the secretary's office between 9.00am – 4.00pm.

Camping fees will be charged per night to exhibitors to cover ground facilities.

Sites can be booked through the secretary. Payments to be received on or before show day.

Powered Sites: \$20 per night or \$100 weekly

Unpowered sites: \$12 per night

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RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The committee may abandon the exhibition or any event thereof through wet weather or any reason, which in the opinion of the committee makes such course advisable. Should the exhibition or any event be abandoned, exhibitors shall be entitled to a return of any entry fee paid, but no cause of action, liability or application shall be maintained or be incurred by the committee or by the Association by any reason of such abandonment or postponement.
2. The entry fee upon all exhibits shall be 10% of the first prize except where otherwise stated in the schedule.
3. All entries to be in writing with the section and the class number of each entry to be plainly stated.
4. All exhibits to be the bona fide property of the exhibitors for one month previous to the date of entry.
5. Exhibitors of stock will be required to provide all particulars with their entries as to age, pedigree of each exhibit, name of breeder, where same is known and then in the case of sheep, when same were last shorn and such other information as required by the committee. Sheep in pens of two or more are debarred from competing in single prizes other than championships.
6. All exhibits in the Agricultural Produce Section must have been grown or made by the exhibitor in the previous twelve months and all exhibits in section N and other manufactured articles must be the bona fide property of and have been made by the exhibitor. No name, number plate or other distinguishing marks to be visible on any manufactured article to be exhibited.
7. The judge may withhold a prize where there is only one exhibit or where they consider the exhibit is not up to show standard.
8. The decision of the judge is final.
9. No exhibitor shall be allowed to remove exhibits from the ground before 4.30pm on the day of the show without the consent of the committee.
10. The stewards shall be appointed by the committee to accompany the judge for each section, except where otherwise provided.
11. Protests against awards must be lodged with the stewards not more than 2 hours after the award has been made, accompanied by a deposit of \$20. The deposit will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous and to be returned in the event of the protest being upheld.
12. Any person interfering with the judges or stewards during the execution of their duties may be removed from the ground.
13. No person other than officials and press representatives shall be allowed in the ring with the judges during competition.
14. No second prize offered, except where otherwise stated, however; the Association's Certificate of Merit shall be given.
15. The committee reserves the right to call upon any exhibitor to make a statutory declaration as to the correctness of bona fides for his or her exhibit.
16. All exhibits must be on the ground for judging no later than 8.45am on the first day of the show, including pavilion exhibits.
17. The Association will not be responsible for any accident that may be responsible for loss or mis-delivery of any livestock or exhibits of any kind or for injury done thereto.
18. In cases of dispute as the interpretation of any rules, the question shall be determined by a majority of the committee of the association, which decision will be determined as final.
19. Entry forms in all pavilion sections must be received by the show secretary via post or email before 7.00pm on the Thursday prior to the show, entries received after this time will incur a \$1 per entry item late fee that will be charged to the exhibitor. Entries must be accompanied by

the necessary fee or paid at the time of collecting section tickets from the secretary and shall not be afterwards changed on any pretext what so ever. All exhibits are required to be delivered to the pavilion with section tickets received by the secretary attached to each individual entry before 8.45am on the Friday where there will be no new entries accepted by the secretary after this time.

20. Judges will not only enter prize exhibits on their awards, but also most other worthy of notice and the judge may award second and third prize instead of a first prize.
21. Proved willful misrepresentations of exhibits will not merely forfeit the prize received, but render the exhibitor liable to be disqualified from exhibition in any future shows of the Association.
22. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT, RELEASE & INDEMNITY - Each exhibitor in consideration of the Association accepting one or more of the exhibitor's entries:
 - a) Acknowledges and agrees that the exhibitor participates in any competition or event conducted during the show, wholly and solely at the exhibitor's own risk of injury to his person or property and
 - b) Releases the Association and its servants and agents at the time of participation, from and against any and all liability for personal injury or damage to the exhibitor's property which the exhibitor may receive, sustain or incur directly or indirectly as a result of the negligence or alleged negligence of the Association and its servants or agents aforesaid resulting from or arising out of any accident or happening occurred whilst the exhibitor for him or herself, their executor, administrators and any person claiming through or under them indemnifies and holds the Association and its servants and agents aforesaid indemnified from and against all claims, demands, suits, actions, damage, cost and expenses which whilst the exhibitor or any person engaged by the exhibitor might be entitled to make or bring against or which may become payable by the Association by reason of or arising from or out of directly or indirectly any such accident or happening of by reason of any act or omission on the part or in the part of any such person engaged by them found in any action against the Association to be negligent shall be deemed to be negligent for the purpose of any claim under the aforesaid indemnity.

SUBMISSION OF PAVILION ENTRIES

The Secretary will be available to accept the paperwork for entries on Wednesday the 7th and Thursday the 8th August 2019 at the secretary's office at the showground from 10.00am – 4.00pm. You will be able to collect your exhibit section tickets at the same time. Entries can be submitted in person or via email to tullamoreshow@outlook.com up to 7.00pm on Thursday 8th August 2019.

Please request a confirmation reply to verify your entries have been received. Any entries received after this time will incur a \$1 per entry late fee and will not be accepted after 8.45am Friday 9th August. Section tickets for emailed entries will be available for pick up from the secretary's office from 8.00am on Friday 9th August 2019, if unable to collect earlier.

GST Requirements

Tullamore PA & H Association Inc has an ABN but is not registered for GST. The Australian Tax Office requires competitors and Judges receiving cash or gift vouchers to the value of \$50 or more to sign the necessary form at the office when collecting payment.

1. Sheep are to be shorn to meet local shearing industry standard
2. Shearers are to be allocated two sheep and may pick the sheep that they wish to shear first. The sheep will be given to the shearer by the rouseabout
3. Shearer to announce start when ready to pull into gear. Timekeeper to keep the time. Time finishes when the shearer pulls out of gear.
4. Shearers will be asked to shear two sheep with a short break in between.
5. Only the fastest qualifying time of the two sheep is to be recorded.
6. To qualify, the shearer must receive two or more green cards for that sheep. Two or more red cards and the shearer's time for that sheep is disqualified. The shearer is entitled to shear the second sheep should disqualification occur on the first. The second sheep is to be shorn under the same rules.
7. The six fastest qualifying times from the first round will progress to the finals.
8. The finals will be divided into two divisions, A and B. A division will be the three fastest qualifying times from the first round.
9. The two divisions will then shear again under the same conditions as for the first round.
10. B division will shear first, with the slowest time recorded, to shear first. A division will then shear next in the same order as B division.
11. The fastest times in each division will be declared the winners or their respective divisions.
12. In the event of the same time being recorded, the shearers will then each shear another sheep in the same qualifying time order as before. This will continue until a winner is declared.
13. During the heats, judges will be asked to inspect both shorn sheep from each shearer prior to moving them from the pen (back to the truck) to determine the cleanest shearer from the heats which will be announced at the end of the competition.
14. Sheep will be crutched and one blow across the bottom of the belly prior to the competition.
15. Judges will be local woolgrowers / shearers. The judge's decision is final.
16. Open competition will be held in conjunction with local competition.
17. Disqualification will occur for the following:
 - Cuts requiring excessive sewing (judge's decision)
 - Excessive second cuts / bad positioning
 - Mistreatment of sheep

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Part 1: Purposes: The purpose of the Rules is:

- a) To provide for the safe conduct of lawn mower racing in Australia; and
- b) To provide specifications for racing lawn mowers in each category as may be amended from time to time; and
- c) To provide a safe environment for all persons attending events; and
- d) To provide that the sport of Lawn Mower Racer in Australia remains a competitive family sport without fear or favour.

Definitions: In these Rules:

- 'Driver' means a competitor in any event.
- 'Event' includes any competition practice or demonstration event.
- 'Helmet' means a full face or motor-cross style motorcycle rider's helmet or race car driver's helmet.
- 'Intoxication' includes being affected by intoxicating liquor or drug, prohibited substance or illegal drug but does not include being affected by medicines which have been prescribed and which are being used in the manner prescribed.
- 'Motor' in these rules means an internal combustion engine naturally operated by any fuel permitted by these Rules.
- 'Regulations' includes rules
- 'Restricted Driver' includes a driver who has not reached the age of 18 years.
- 'Unrestricted Driver' in these Rules, is a driver over the age of 18 years.
- 'Rules' includes regulations.
- 'Ride on Lawn Mower' means a motor driven vehicle which has been specifically designed and sold commercially for mowing residential type lawns but does not include small tractors with or without their attachments.
- 'Grid' means starting line.
- 'Steward or Marshall' means an official or person assigned the task of supervising behavior and other matters in the pit, track areas.
- 'Track Area' means track and includes the racetrack and surrounding area to any external boundaries, which have been clearly defined as an are prohibited for access by unauthorised persons.
- 'Unauthorised persons' include any persons not included in a team or crew.

Part 2: Driver Eligibility and Requirements:

1. **Minimum age for drivers:** The minimum age for unrestricted drivers shall be 18 years.

All drivers 15 to 17 years of age only permitted to drive non-modified mowers.

2. **Drivers to sign release form liability:** All drivers before being eligible to participate in any event shall sign and submit a release or indemnity in
3. **Eligible Drivers:** Eligible drivers are drivers who have submitted the required forms and have paid the entry fee,
4. **Intoxication:** No one shall be permitted to a) Participate in any event; or, b) Enter the pit area; or, c) Enter the track area; - Whilst he/she is under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs.
5. **Safety Briefing:** All drivers must attend a safety briefing prior to commencement of racing, including Rules and Course Layout.

Part 3: Mower Eligibility:

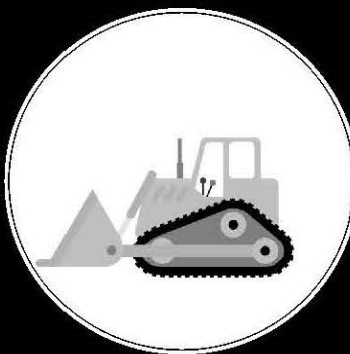
a) All Mowers

6. **Eligible Mowers:** Events are open to all self-propelled rotary or reel type mowers which were originally designed and commercially sold to cut lawns, and comply with the provisions of these Rules.
7. **Good working order:** Mowers must be in good working order and inspected prior to the race. All mowers must demonstrate the ability to corner and stop safely at the safety briefing.
8. **Motors and engines:** No fuel injected or turbo engines are permitted. Only carbureted naturally aspirated internal combustion engines operated by any fuel under the provision of these rules will be allowed. All Stock mowers shall present in their original configuration with engines 'untuned'.
9. **Mower blades:** All blades and cutters are to be removed.
10. **Cut-off switch requirements:** All participating mowers shall be fitted with an operational cut off switch of an approved type (this excludes homemade); and which is connected to the driver by means of a lanyard.
11. **Petrol tanks:** Petrol tanks are to be constructed of an approved type (no plastic bottles); and need to be secured and covered.
12. **Brake requirements:** Mowers must be fitted with an effective rear braking system only, which must brake the driving wheels. No front brakes.
13. **Sharp or dangerous protrusions:** Mowers which have sharp or dangerous protrusion shall be deemed ineligible for participation until such sharp or dangerous protrusions have been made safe or removed. Stock mowers must have cutting decks in place and cutting blades must be removed.
14. **Guards:** Guards must be covering chains.
15. **Handlebars must be plugged:** Handlebars constructed of hollow tubing, which are fitted to a ride-on lawnmower, shall be deemed unsafe unless the ends of the handlebars are solidly and securely blocked or plugged. Steering mechanisms must be securely fitted.
16. **Bonnets Secure:** Bonnets must be properly secured in the close position.
17. **Suspension not permitted:** Mowers shall not be fitted with suspension to the front or the rear wheels; however springs under the seat as such are permissible. Mowers must have a fixed rear axle, not pivoting.
18. **Batteries:** Batteries shall be securely mounted.

19. **Nudge bars not permitted:** Rear bars are permitted providing it does not exceed the width of the rear tyres or widest point of the mower.
 20. **Subsequent technical inspection requirement:** Any mower deemed ineligible for participation must be re-inspected by the technical inspector and approved for participation in the approved manner.
 21. **Maximum Size:** The maximum width of the mower shall be 1.0metres or 39" at the widest point. The maximum length of any mower shall be deemed by the structural soundness of the lengthening procedure.
 22. **Mower to be readily recognized as a mower:** Any alterations, repairs or replacements to the body or chassis of the mower are permitted provided the mower retains the appearance of, and can be readily recognized, as a ride-on lawnmower.
 23. **Tyres:** Tyres which are fitted to any competition mower must comply with the following to minimize damage to track –
 - a) Tyres commonly fitted to 'All-Terrain Vehicles (ATV) are permitted
 - b) Any type of pattern tyres including 'knobby' type turf tyres, and which are sold for use in lawnmowers are permitted.
 - c) Any tyres fitted with tractor type lugs are not permitted.
 - d) All front tyres must have tubes.
 24. **Wheel Rims:** Wheel rims shall be of steel or machined alloy only and be of a one piece or welded construction. No two-piece rims are permitted.
- b) Additional Requirements for Modified Motors:**
25. **Brake requirements:** Shall be fitted with a braking system such as hydraulic calipers applied to a braking disc, which is securely affixed to the driving axle and which slows both wheels simultaneously.
 26. **Chassis Modification:** Modifications for the purpose of strengthening the chassis are acceptable. All chassis modifications are to be made out of mild steel. The use of exotic materials (e.g. aluminum, carbon fibre, or alloy composition) is not permitted.
 27. **Pulley/driveline modifications:** Pulley/driveline modifications are acceptable as long as all moving parts are guarded.
 28. **Cutting decks/blades:** Cutting decks may be removed, all cutting blades must be removed.
 29. **Wheel/Suspension:** Wheel and suspension changes are acceptable.
 30. **Engines:** Non-standard engines are permitted but limited to commercial engines (e.g. Honda, Vanguard, Briggs & Stratton) with a 20 horsepower limit for both horizontal and vertical shafts and nothing over 250cc or equivalent for motorcycle type engines.
 31. **Throttle Return:** All modified motors must be fitted with an automatic throttle closing device, e.g. spring.
- Part 4: Fuel**
32. **Permissible Fuel:** Petroleum or gasoline products commonly referred to as: super, avgas, unleaded, lead replacement and premium unleaded are permitted fuels.
 33. **Prohibited Fuels:** Fuel, petroleum, or gasoline products – a) not described in 27; or b) is a fuel commonly referred to as nitrous oxide, NO₂, or laughing gas; or c) is a fuel commonly referred to as methanol or alcohol; or d) is any fuel commonly referred to as LPG or liquid petroleum gas; or e) is any fuel which is stored in a pressurized tank or container.
- Part 5: Driver Equipment**
34. **Helmet:** Every driver shall wear a protective helmet (to be supplied by the competitor) which complies with these Rules; a) Fits snugly on the head; and b) Must be securely buckled when the driver is operating a vehicle on the track area; c) if using a motor-cross style helmet then goggles must be worn. But does not include hard hats, bicycle rider's helmets or other safety equipment of lesser quality.
 35. **Clothing:** Every driver shall wear a safety vest (to be supplied by the competitor) and fullbody clothing. Drivers are recommended to wear body armour or adequate padding in addition to clothing. Every driver shall wear enclosed footwear. Every driver shall be responsible for ensuring that clothing cannot be fouled or caught up in the machinery, chains, belts, or any moving part of his or her mower. Guards must be fitted to prevent this.
- Part 6: Pit and Track Areas**
36. **Persons not permitted on grid:** No unauthorised person shall be permitted on the grid; only mowers, riders, Steward or Starter.
 37. **Dismounting from mowers:** Mowers must be completely stopped and stationary before a driver dismounts.
 38. **No pets on pit or track area:** No pets are allowed on the pit area or on the track area.
 39. **Smoking and alcohol:** There will be no smoking or consuming of alcohol in the pit or track areas at any time.
- Part 7: Technical Inspections:**
40. **Mowers must be approved for participation:** The Technical Inspector in any event must first approve any mower. Any fault detected must be rectified before further competition.
 41. **Re-inspection may be conducted at any time:** At any time deemed necessary, the technical inspector may require the driver to participate in a re-inspection of the mower before participation can continue.
 42. **Unsafe or unstable construction:** The Technical Inspector may refuse any mower on grounds of unsafe or unstable construction.
 43. **Re-inspection after an accident:** Drivers involved in an accident must be re-inspected in the pit or track area.
 44. **Driver responsibility to designate correct mower classification:** It is the responsibility of the driver to correctly designate the engine type, size and event classification.
 45. **Mower Rejection:** The Show Society reserves the right to reject at any time any mower which in their opinion represents an attempt to defeat the spirit of these Rules, even though such mower complies with the letter in these rules.
- Part 8: Racing:**
46. **Heats:** Each heat will comprise three mowers. The winner of each heat proceeds to the final. If the final comprises more than three mowers then a semi-final is conducted before the final race.
 47. **Racing track:** The track will be set up in the main ring, with 3 lanes marked with witches' hats.
 48. **Red flags:** Indicate all mowers must stop immediately.
 49. **Disqualification:** Competitors may be disqualified if competitors; a) are seen to be leaving your lane or barging or bumping into other races whilst racing, or, b) cut corners and don't join the race behind the group they were racing with, or, c) are driving in a reckless manner risking injury to themselves or others, or d) have some part of your mower hanging that may cause injury to others.
 50. **Spectators:** To remain behind the fence, including riders in other heats not competing at the time.
 51. **Track officials:** Will be on hand at the time of the event to oversee safety, in addition to the race caller and race operator. The race operator reserves the right to stop any heat or final race in the interests of safety.

ASC DRYLAND FIELD WHEAT COMPETITION

Date to be advised.

ASC SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

1. Only the winning crop in a local competition is to be entered into the Regional Championships. If that crop should be damaged by storm or other cause prior to the judging it may, with the approval of the competitor, be withdrawn in favour of the next best crop.
2. One entry may be made in the name of the owner of the property on which the wheat is grown. However, if it is a share farm or partnership arrangement the entry may be submitted in joint names.
3. Individual competitors will be notified of the date and time when the local judge will inspect the crop by the local competition steward of the local society. On receipt of this notice competitors must complete a cropping details sheet, ready to hand to the judge. This is available from the crop competition steward.
4. A competitor is not eligible to enter in two different local competitions with a crop or crops from the one property in respect of the ASC Field Wheat Competition.
5. Varieties of wheat shall be limited to Bread Wheats only, and those currently recommended by the Regional Silo Group for the location in which the crops are grown. Each competitor must enter a plot of 16 hectares of wheat of one variety. It must have been sown in one paddock. One side of the pegged area must be bordered by a fence, waterway, creek or roadway. Areas which are pegged irregularly across a paddock to avoid poor or eroded patches are not eligible. Recognised soil erosion control measures including strip farming shall not prejudice the interpretation of this.
6. A crop grown on ground artificially watered after 1st January, 2019 shall not be eligible.
7. No entry fee is required by the ASC for the Regional Championship. There is no local entry fee.
8. The ASC requires notification by the Show Societies, Agricultural Bureau and NSW Farmers Association of their intention to conduct a local competition. Individual entries must be lodged with the ASC Dryland Wheat Competition Steward of the local society conducting the local competition.
9. The ASC will advise the Secretary of the local show society of the date and time when the judge of the Regional Championship will arrive to inspect the winning crop. The local Secretary will advise the competitor of these details. THE DUPLICATE COPY OF THE CROPPING DETAILS SHEET MUST BE AVAILABLE TO THE REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP JUDGE ON ARRIVAL.
10. Crops in both local and Regional Championship competitions will be judged on the following scale:

Apparent Yield	20 points for every tonne (per hectare) no limit
Trueness to Type and Purity	15 points
Freedom from Disease	15 points
Evenness and Condition	15 points
Freedom from Weeds	15 points
Farming Practices	15 points

Rich Fruit Cake Competition

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants for Section P Class 2. The winner is eligible to compete in the Group Final in Forbes in February. Must be a second cake.

Here's what you need

250 g (8 oz) sultanas	1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
250 g (8 oz) chopped raisins	1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
250 g (8 oz) currants	250 g (8 oz) butter
125 g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel	250 g (8 oz) soft brown sugar
90 g (3 oz) chopped red glace cherries	1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated
90 g (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds	lemon rind
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	1/2 teaspoon almond essence
250 g (8oz) plain flour	1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
60 g (2 oz) self raising flour	4 large eggs
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg	

Here's what you do

- Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
- Sift together the flours and spices.
- Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
- Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2-4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

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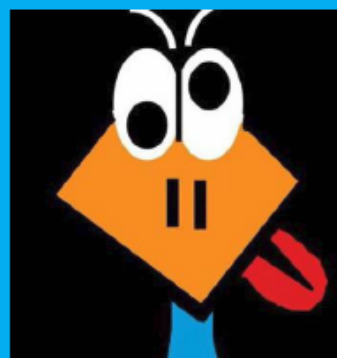
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
